

My Re-Scha feeding Methods

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The most important thing to remember when introducing any new taste to a Budgerigar is to do it slowly, and not when they are breeding, as any change in diet, will be met with resistance and you will just defeat the purpose.

So with that in mind, start with the birds in the flights and any young birds you may have, and introduce the products in the following manner.

Take a one litre measuring jug and fill it with Groats, then pour the Groats into a large plastic bowl, a baking bowl is ideal, as it has no corners when mixing. Then pour boiling water over the Groats and leave for twenty minutes, and no more than twenty minutes, as soaking Groats over night leads to a fungal build up.

Strain the Groats and **rinse thoroughly!!!**. Then pour the contents of one cap full of Frutin over the Groats, mix well and feed to the birds in a shallow tray, so that they are all available, as a thin layer.

Place in the flight and just watch them being devoured. The birds love them so much so that my lads immediately come to me looking for this as soon as I enter the Bird room.

Give this feed everyday for a week, **before you add the PT12.**

To add the PT12 to the above mixture, empty the contents of one sachet of **PT12 per 30 birds** onto a saucer. To this add **one capful of Frutin per sachet of PT12.** Mix slowly and make sure you blend in all the PT12 powder with the Frutin. When you feel you have all the PT12 blended, just add two or three **drops** of water to thin this mixture. You want to be able to tilt the saucer and have this mixture run smoothly off.

Just as we did above add this mixture to the soaked Groats instead of the Frutin only mixture. You can be now sure that your birds are getting the PT12 into them, and that the Frutin is acting as a Catalyst, by increasing the rapid growth of the Lactobacillus Salivarius, and therefore its establishment in the gut of the birds. **Give this feed every day for at least 14 days.**

*If you wish to give PT12 immediately to your breeding pairs, mix it dry(No Frutin) with your seed mixture, it works just as well. Add the Frutin to the drinking water, again a cap full to two litres of water, and **feed the sintra** through the soft food, as described below.*

Soft Food:

Whatever soft food you are using, stick with it if it works for you. For me this is how I feed, Sintra, and Frucht Mash.

Carrots and Broccoli are prepared in a blender every day. To this mix I add two scoops of **Sintra**, and to begin with a half scoop of **Frucht Mash**. You can increase the Frucht Mash to a scoop full as the birds get used to the Sweet taste.

To this mixture I add my Orlux egg food and my Thrive and Gloss. This mixture is fed twice a day to breeding pairs and once a day in the flights, early in the morning.

I have found through trial and error that this method works and that the birds get the full range of Re-Scha products into them, without waste.

Panta 20 is added to the water three times a week at an inclusion rate of 2 ml to the litre.
